

SETUP FAMILY DEVOTION



Family devotions don't magically happen...it takes intentionality. Pick a resource and go for it. The goal is not perfection but progress.

Set expectations:

Make sure everyone is clear about the what and the why of family devotions. Whether you have a three-year old or a thirteen-year old you can expect difficulty but don't give up.

Set a time:

One of the most important parts of setting up a game plan is setting up a time. Here are three easy times for you and your family to establish consistent family devotions:

- Do it before school if you're morning people then try and send the kids out the door with the Word of God on their lips.
- 2. Do it at dinner this might be one of the only times in the entire day you are all together for any amount of time.
- 3. Do it before bed if you're not morning people try and set up family devotions right before the kids hit the hay.

Go for it:

Give it a shot for a month or even a week. See what worked and what didn't work. Try different resources, different times. Keep trying!
